FINANCIAL SUPPORTS

Advance Child Tax Credit Payments

Auto Insurance Payment Assistance

If you live in Hennepin County, have experienced a financial hardship due to COVID-19, have income below 200% poverty guidelines and have a difficulty making payments on your auto insurance, you may be eligible for up to 6 months in auto insurance payment assistance. Emergency Broadband Benefit Program

The **Emergency Broadband Benefit Program** is a Federal Communications Commission (FCC) program that provides a temporary discount on monthly broadband bills for qualifying households. Energy Assistance Program

(Renters & Homeowners)

If you need help paying your energy bills and want to prevent a shut off..... The Energy Assistance Program can help you pay up to \$1,200 in energy expenses-- such as a heating bill. This grant is paid directly to your energy provider, to reduce your energy bill.

Due. Up to 15 months of assistance is available. If you meet all of the follow, you are invited to **APPLY NOW** for rental/utility assistance.

• Are you a renter living in Minnesota?

- Are you qualified for unemployment insurance? OR, Have you been negatively impacted by COVID-19 in any way?
- Do you have past rent due?
- Do you know the annual income of all adults in your household.
- To be eligible you must meet 80% AMI [Hennepin county: 4-person HH- \$79,900] AMI chart by county

Households who are current on their rent payments and need help with future rent will able to apply later. VEAP- 9600 Aldrich Ave, Bloomington Navigators from African Women and Youth Resource Center will help community members apply for rental assistance, offering support in English, Somali and Spanish.
